Dear Parents and Carers,

- Resilience is having the ability to bounce back from challenges and setbacks, maintain a positive mindset, and persevere in the learning journey.
- Responsibility involves taking ownership of one's actions and consequences, demonstrating reliability, trustworthiness, and accountability.

I ask for your support in reinforcing these values, as the partnership between the Academy and families is vital in helping students develop strong character alongside other aspects of success. There are firm processes in place to acknowledge and reward students for being caught demonstrating these character virtues. Additionally, there are now more opportunities than ever for students to be acknowledged through 'Weekly Stars', with a Senior Leader allocating one every lesson, every day.

I am aiming to communicate several further developments over the coming weeks, all of which seek to improve students' experiences of being enrolled at the Academy.
