We have invested in an innovative literacy improvement tool called Bedrock Vocabulary. It is a website that helps children to learn very important academic vocabulary, whilst encouraging them to read regularly.

Did you know that children with wide vocabularies make excellent progress at school and in further education?

As your child progresses through the curriculum, they will study hundreds of words, whilst reading fiction and non-fiction texts regularly. They will also fill in an online knowledge organiser to practise using this vocabulary, and you can see and edit this yourself!

Why not help your child to make even greater progress by logging on to see how they are getting on? You will be able to see the vocabulary your child is learning, which we encourage you to use in conversation at home.

You can head over to the site and create your own account now:

Your access code is: «AccessCode»

Step 1: Visit app.bedrocklearning.org.

Step 2: Click on the 'Guardian/Teacher' tab.

Step 3: Complete the parent sign up sheet and enter the access code provided to you by the school and create an account.

Step 4: Check your email for your password, and then log in. Be sure to check your junk folder if no email arrives.

Step 5: Use Bedrock's single sign on feature if you have a Google or Microsoft email address. This will make it really easy for you to check your child's progress on Bedrock regularly.

Step 6: Weekly emails will help you give your child those all important nudges of encouragement without even logging into your dashboard.
